For the Pastor from Brother Young

Dear Pastor,

Greetings. We are eagerly anticipating a great meeting and are asking God to allow us to see many revived and many saved.

Obviously, the main responsibility for preparing for the revival falls on your shoulders. When little is done to prepare the church for the revival, the results are always limited. When much is done, the doors almost always are opened for a grand meeting where God adds to the church and the church is stirred to holy living and soul winning. Prayer is certainly important.

Advertising the services is important. Challenging your church family well in advance to clear their schedules, to contact visitors and get them lined up to come on a specific night, and to try to win at least one soul to Christ during the meeting can do some amazing things, not only for the revival meeting itself, but for your entire church family.

Please determine now to make the revival meeting a priority. I encourage churches to put everything “on hold” for one week and to devote all of our energies and efforts to a successful revival campaign. Christian school practices, AWANA clubs, and ball games are certainly important to your church, but can greatly hinder a revival meeting. Canceling ball games and AWANA clubs and shortening ball practices will go a long way in encouraging people to be an avid participator in the revival campaign. Please pray for wisdom in these matters. We are praying that God will meet with us mightily and that nothing will hinder His working during the revival services.

I believe with all of my heart, if we will pray and get the lost to every service, we will see souls saved and added to your church. Why not challenge your people in these areas:

1. Pray daily for revival in your church and for souls to be saved and added to the church family. Consider fasting and prayer. Ask God to show us wicked ways that have sneaked into our lives and to give us the courage to do right in confessing and forsaking them.
2. Work to see souls saved. Make a list of souls you want to win to Christ and then pray for them everyday. Go talk to them. Try to get them to church. Try to win them to Christ. Work to get them baptized and joined to the church family.
3. Memorize II Chronicles 7:14 and pray it often. Ask God to reveal that verse to you.

Pastor, let's have a grand revival! Let's ask God to allow us to see many saved and many added to the church. It is our desire that all of our attention be focused on the Lord Jesus Christ and the power of His infallible and inspired Word.

Please know that we are praying for you and trust that this packet of Revival Preparation Materials will be of great help as you plan and prepare. *Use what will help you and your church: disregard anything that is not needed.* Please write or call if you have any questions that we have left unanswered.

Our Revival Team Philosophy

Down through history, evangelists have often traveled with teams, usually for the purpose of helping with music, soul winning, and preaching. We have often done so ourselves. It is our belief, however, that our primary “team” relationship is with the individual church and staff during a campaign. Together we can work toward three goals. We want the week to be a blessing and an encouragement to the entire church family. We want the messages, the singing, the revival choir, the special songs, the instrumental music, and the Children’s Revival Hour to bless and encourage believers. We also want to emphasize the preaching of the Word of God in order that believers can be convicted of sin, challenged to holy living, and conformed to the image of Jesus Christ. We believe that as we “draw nigh to God, He will draw nigh to [us].” Finally, we desire to preach the Gospel believing that souls will be saved and added to the local church. Each of these three goals are important in a revival campaign and each of these three goals can be met if we will work together.

It is our desire that the revival services become unique to this particular revival. They are not *just* another service nor are they *just* part of another revival. By working together with the Pastor and the church family, we can not only see the church revived, but also see many souls saved.

Let’s pray much between now and the revival services. We will be praying and preparing and trust God to meet with us mightily.

Biographical Information

Evangelist Dave Young, president of the Dave Young Evangelistic Association, has been conducting evangelistic revival campaigns since the fall of 1994! He has preached in over 400 revival campaigns in over 35 states, in Canada, Europe, Haiti, and the Philippines. He came to know Christ at the age of fifteen and preached his first sermon a few months later. He has preached in forty-four states and in six different countries. David and his wife Bethlie were married in 1993 and have been traveling together since then. They currently have five children: Abigail, Joshua, Matthew, Jacob; and Charity; and, since the birth of Abigail in 1996 have made a Fifth Wheel Travel Trailer their primary residence. Bethlie participates in the music programs of each campaign and currently home schools the children.

Brother Young not only conducts local church revival campaigns, he also preaches in many *Family Matters Conferences*, Christian Camps, and on college campuses. He also has been instrumental in helping to start Independent Baptist College of Asia-Pacific in Manila, Philippines and helps in a variety of church-planting ministries around the world!

Dave Corn serves as an Associate Evangelist with Dave Young. He conducts children and youth programs, helps in song leading and special music, plays the piano, and preaches and teaches as well. Dave is especially known for the illusions he incorporates into his children's programs.

We have three goals in each campaign. First, it is our sincere desire to be a blessing and an encouragement to local churches. Second, it is our desire to see revival (new life) in every heart and in every home in each church congregation. Third, it is our passion to see souls saved and added to the local church. We have given our lives to these three goals!

Financing the Revival

RV Expenses

We come to each revival on an expenses-plus-love-offering basis, believing that as we pray about our needs and as your people pray about what to give, God will supply specifically.

Expenses

Many churches will pay for the expenses of the evangelist by budgeting the amount needed. Others prefer to take an offering specifically designated as expenses. At any rate, expenses average about \$450.00 per meeting. Should the church wish to help with the cost of expenses, please make the check payable to *David Young Evangelistic Association* and designate the amount for *Travel Expenses*. If for any reason, the cost of expenses poses a problem for the church, please do not hesitate to call and chat with us about it. We know that our God will provide. If that amount can be sent in advance, or given early in a revival week, that would be a great help and added blessing! The expense check covers a portion of the cost of our traveling with a large RV. We also use that amount to pay for our Assistant Evangelist's expenses.

Offerings

We live solely on the love offerings given to us by God's people. Although we certainly do not wish to make a *big deal* concerning finances, we do wish to be wise in our approach to the offerings. Paul taught that they which "preach the Gospel should live of the Gospel." If the Pastor simply lets the people know that we are dependent on their giving to meet our needs and encourages them to pray about their giving and to give only as God directs them to do so, our needs will be met. Financing the Revival

Airline Expenses

We come to each revival on an expenses-plus-love-offering basis, believing that as we pray about our needs and as your people pray about what to give, God will supply specifically.

Expenses

We will do everything possible to keep expenses at a minimum. We will purchase tickets as economically as possible and will let the church know the cost of those as soon as we have the tickets confirmed. Of course, we are dependent on the church for our accommodations as well as our meals during the revival campaign. A simple, inexpensive motel is fine with us. We do not want these expenses to be an unnecessary burden to the church and will do everything in our ability to be wise in expense matters.

Offerings

We live solely on the love offerings given to us by God's people. Although we certainly do not wish to make a *big deal* concerning finances, we do wish to be wise in our approach to the offerings. Paul taught that they which "preach the Gospel should live of the Gospel." If the Pastor simply lets the church know that we are dependent on their giving to meet our needs and encourages them to pray about their giving and to give only as God directs them to do so, our needs will be met. Meals and Daily Schedule

Meals

It is our preference to eat the majority of our meals in our home and/or at the church. We certainly do not mind eating with others once or twice during the week and in most revivals eat the noon meal on Sunday with the Pastor and his family. This meal allows us some time together early in the week. We are able to take care of all of our meals *if* the church needs us to do so. However, if some in the church family would like to prepare one meal each day, that will also be a great help and blessing. We prefer that the meals be brought to the trailer and we prefer to eat earlier in the day. If possible we eat our *main* meal of the day at noon. However, if folks wish to provide a meal and need to deliver it later, that will be fine with us. If a list of all of the meals and the delivery times could be given to us when we arrive, that would be very helpful too.

Please express to the church family that we do not intend to be unsociable. Because we are on the road almost 40-45 weeks per year, eating out and eating in homes on a daily basis not only causes us to have to struggle to be adequately prepared for the services, but is very difficult on our children. We sincerely appreciate your help and understanding. Should something need to be changed, of course, we will do our best to accommodate those changes. Please let Brother Young know if you have any questions at all!

Daily Schedule

We generally spend our mornings preparing for and preaching in chapels, studying, taking care of office matters of accounting and correspondence, and preparing for the evening services. We do make ourselves available for soul-winning visits several afternoons each week. We *prefer* to visit those who are unsaved and who have specific spiritual needs. When we arrive, we can discuss the schedule for the week and make any necessary changes or adjustments. It is helpful if we can schedule *two free afternoons* each week: the first one in order that we can do general maintenance and repair work on the truck and trailer and the second that we can spend some quality time as a family. We will often eat a meal together, go to a mall, or do some sightseeing. Because Saturdays are usually very full travel days, the free afternoon is very valuable to our families. Please remember that my wife is very busy taking care of our children. As a result, she will seldom be available. All of our children are in school "on the road" and they require very daily, disciplined schedules just like your family! We are very grateful for your understanding in these matters.

Meal Schedule for the Revival Week

Providing a list of those who will be bringing meals for the week allows us to not only get to know the people but also to thank them properly. Under miscellaneous please list anything we would need to know, such as when the meals are coming or any special instructions for that day. Thank you so much for your hospitality in hosting our family.

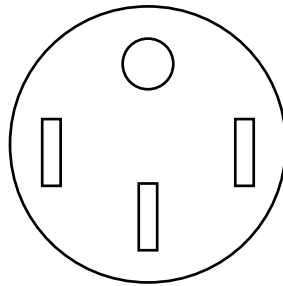

RV Accommodations

We live in a fifth wheel travel trailer. The trailer requires a level place to park (preferably at the church), an outside water source, and access to a 50 amp, 220 volt outlet. Wires can be run to a church fuse panel by the evangelist if necessary. If possible, a key to the church is also appreciated.

Some churches have parked the trailers at RV parks. Although we do not prefer it, should you decide to do so, please request at least 30 amp service and make certain that each site has access to water and sewage. The RVer would ask for “30 or 50 amp with full hookups.”

If you desire to install the 220 volt, 50 amp electrical outlet for the trailer, the following is a diagram of the type of outlet that is needed:



Please do remember that we are usually able to find adequate electricity even if the church is unable to add these type of electrical outlets. We will be happy to work on the specifics after arrival.

Music and the Invitation

Music

Music is certainly a vitally important aspect of a revival campaign. We have traveled with teams who handled the music and have also worked with the church's current music program. We request that the church choose special music and choir specials with the revival in mind. Happy, faster paced, gospel songs are preferable to more formal, slower-paced ones. We prefer the service to have a triumphant note of expectancy rather than a somber note of quietness. When possible, we also like to participate in the music program. Bethlie sings and plays the piano and can provide some special music as well as some offertories through the week. Our family also sings several times each week. If we can meet with or talk with the music director after arrival, we can discuss and plan the entire week together.

The Revival Choir

Having the choir sing during a revival is always a great blessing, not only to the choir itself, but also to the entire church family. Consider opening with a rousing "revival" chorus in each service, and when possible, provide a special as well.

Invitation

It is our goal that the invitations will be a blessing both in their simplicity and their clarity. Brother Young usually asks for a show of hands based on the presentation of the truth given in the message, and then invites folks to respond publicly for prayer and/or counsel. He suggests that the Pastor and his staff be near the front during the invitations in order to counsel those who need it. He also suggests that counselors be prepared and instructed to take salvation inquirers to a private room where the counselor can have all the time necessary to instruct them not only concerning their need of being born again, but also concerning baptism and church membership should they trust Christ.

Mrs. Young plays the piano during the invitation and if Brother Young desires for the congregation to sing, he usually leads the music himself. Neither the music director nor the musicians will need to come to the platform. It is our desire that the church music staff not only have a break from their music involvement in this part of the service, but that they will also be free to respond themselves as well as help with needed counseling.

For the Church Music Director

Dear Church Music Director:

We thank God for you and the work you do in helping God's people to worship the Lord in music and singing. Every church that has a Godly and Spirit-filled music director as well as Godly and Spirit-filled musicians is a blessed church indeed! We are eager to work with you and the church during the upcoming Revival Crusade and hope that the revival is especially a blessing to you and the church musicians.

Please consider your part in the revival vitally important. You set the tone for the entire service by your selection of congregational hymns, the choir special, and the other specials too. Keeping the service revival oriented is essential. For instance, choose hymns that are triumphant ("Saved, Saved, Saved") rather than reflective ("Do You Really Want Revival?"). Use your very best specials. I suggest that you ask Pastor to choose his favorite choir numbers and sing them throughout the week. Choose a faster-paced revival chorus to open each service. We have some available if you wish for us to send one in advance. It can be copied and learned by the church prior to the revival week. If at all possible, I would love to meet with you on Saturday and go over the week's music program with you and pastor prior to the Sunday morning service. Please know that I am praying much for God's direction concerning your part in the revival campaign.

Our family can help some with the music. Bethlie plays the piano and can accompany congregational music, provide preludes and postludes, and help with some offertories. She also sings solos. Our family can sing several specials as well.

We hope that you will join us in praying for the music program during the revival. We believe that God is going to meet with us in a mighty way.

Sunday School

Using the Sunday School hour as an extension of the revival can be a great asset to the entire meeting. We recommend combining junior high through adult classes into one large class for the week of the revival. During that time we can be introduced, pertinent announcements about the week can be made, and an applicable lesson can be taught.

Generally we would follow a schedule such as this:

Opening Song and *usual* Sunday School announcements

Introduction of Evangelist Dave Young by the Pastor

Greetings from Evangelist Dave Young

Introduction of the family

Testimony from Bethlie or other team member

Revival Week announcements

Lesson from Evangelist Dave Young

The Revival Adventure

A Revival Program for Youth through the Sixth Grade

We are prepared to conduct a children's program during each evening service beginning Sunday evening. Our associate evangelist will be handling these services and will not only have music and Bible stories, but also Bible preaching. His program will include allusions and balloon animals as well. Children sixth grade and under will be dismissed from the main service just prior to the preaching. It is usually best if three and four year olds can be supervised in the nursery. We also request at least one church member (or one couple from the church) to be present during the children's meetings each evening. They can help with everything from crowd control to bathroom breaks to finding a parent should a child need its parent for any reason.

Promoting and advertising The Revival Adventure can often be a great help in not only getting church people to be faithful to the meeting, but also in getting un-churched families to attend. A separate sheet is enclosed for the church workers to read as well as a sheet to record each evening's helpers. A reproducible flyer is also enclosed!

Note for *The Revival Adventure* Helpers

Thank you so much for your willingness to help in The Revival Adventure during revival week. Each evening, Brother Young will dismiss the youth just prior to the reading of his text. Please exit the auditorium with the youth and as you enter the designated area where the children will be meeting, help them to be seated. The Revival Adventure Evangelist will conduct the entire service with singing, a missionary story, a fun time, and a Bible message! We request that you do two things:

PARTICIPATE

Please sit with the group, sing the songs, listen to the message, and be ready, if necessary, to counsel with any youth who respond to the times of invitations. Have your Bible and be prepared to pray with any youth who respond. If you find that you need help in dealing with someone, please get Brother Dave to help you! After you pray with someone, try to take them to Brother Dave and let them tell him about their decision. Brother Dave will fill out "decision cards" and make certain that they are given to the pastoral staff.

HELP

Your help will be a great asset to the services running smoothly. Quietly and discreetly attempt to encourage unruly and/or misbehaving children. Have children who are especially difficult sit with you just behind everyone else. Help with the children who need to use the restroom. Should a child obviously need a parent's attention, please alert an usher to get the parents from the main auditorium, or as quietly and discreetly as possible, enter the auditorium and get them yourself.

Following the conclusion of the main service, the children will be dismissed to return to the auditorium to locate their parents. If there are children visiting, help them to locate their parents.

Special Nights during the Revival Crusade

We have observed that in every meeting where the church worked to bring visitors, people have been saved. Enclosed are some simple suggestions for “special nights” that will encourage everyone to be involved in bringing souls to the services. Consider these thoughts:

1. Special nights are simply a tool to help your people invite their friends, families, and acquaintances.
2. Special nights should be chosen, printed, and distributed to the church body several weeks or so prior to the meeting.
3. A good crowd will encourage and excite your people in an unbelievable way.
4. I will briefly promote the special nights each evening during the announcement time. It will be imperative to promote, recognize, and reward in five minutes or less. We are always able to do so if we plan and prepare carefully.

You must feel comfortable with any promotional outreach. Feel free to change these, make new ones, use an entirely different means of encouraging attendance, or use nothing at all. We are coming to serve you.

SUNDAY NIGHT IS ALL CHURCH NIGHT

Our goal is to have every Sunday morning attendee present on Sunday evening. Promoting this service will be totally the Pastor’s responsibility. Pastor, call those who do not normally attend Sunday night and urge them to be present.

MONDAY NIGHT IS SUNDAY SCHOOL NIGHT

Monday night’s goal is for each class to have as many in attendance Monday night as they average in Sunday School. Each teacher should determine their weekly average and work hard to have at least that many in church Monday evening. Every teacher should personally contact each student and urge them to attend Monday evening.

TUESDAY NIGHT IS FRIEND AND FAMILY NIGHT

Encourage every church member to bring friends and family.

WEDNESDAY NIGHT IS YOUTH PACK A PEW NIGHT

This service is to encourage the youth to get involved. Each young person will be challenged to invite and bring as many people as possible. Anyone can be invited as a guest (church folk, the Pastor, the Evangelist, other children, parents, adults, neighbors, grandparents, etc.). All regular attendees will be worth 10 points; all visitors will be worth 100 points. A visitor is anyone who has not yet been to the revival. On Wednesday night, two men from the church can meet folks as they arrive and can keep a running total for each young person. During the announcements, we will not only praise all the youth collectively, we can also honor the two who have the most points. A nice Bible could be given to the top junior age youth as well as to the top teen! Some pastors take the winners out for a meal and take them to a bookstore and let them pick the Bible they want. We have been in revival campaigns where the pastor gave gifts

of music, T-shirts, or gift-certificates. You can decide whether or not to use gifts and exactly what you will give away if you decide to use them.

THURSDAY NIGHT IS **FAMILY NIGHT**

Encourage the church to invite family members. I often promote this service in several ways. First, many have family members in the area and should work to get all of them to the service. Second, many have friends in the area who are “just like family.” Invite these as well. Finally, encourage the church to work to have the entire church family represented as well. Invite those who have not been for some time. Invite those who attended at one time, but for whatever reason, no longer do. This can be a great night if everyone will work hard to get family members present.

FRIDAY NIGHT IS **GOSPEL NIGHT**

This entire service will be focused on seeing souls saved and will be promoted early in the week. The Gospel will be presented very clearly that evening.

TV Fast and Family Prayer Time

The church body committing to a Television Fast and Family Prayer Time each day of the revival meeting can be a tremendous help to the revival. Although many have de-emphasized family prayer and family devotions, relatively few have de-emphasized the effect of television in their home and family.

The TV Fast will not only help the revival meeting, it will also help your people to be more spiritually minded and will thus be of great benefit to your church long after the revival meeting comes to an end. It will help the revival by preventing our focus from being turned to carnality, sensuality, and wickedness following the services each evening. It will show your people just how addicted they really are to TV and its continual diet of worldliness. It will reveal just how much time is consumed by TV. As they return home following each service, refraining from watching the TV will give them time to reflect on what God is doing in their lives and in the lives of their spouses and children. As your people grow, it will give new vitality and focus to your church.

Challenge the church family to have a brief time of family prayer each day. For most folks, just before bedtime is usually the most advantageous time. Gather in the living room or kitchen or Mom and Dad's bedroom and pray for several minutes. If each family in the church will pray each day, we will not only see the family strengthened, but we will also see greater revival results for the glory of God. It has been our discovery that in the average fundamental church in America, few families pray together on a consistent basis.

Enclosed are some forms which can be photocopied and given to the church family in order to encourage them to participate in the TV Fast and Family Prayer Time.

Christian School Chapels

We are prepared to conduct Christian School chapels during the Revival Week. Brother Young and Brother Corn will preach. Brother Corn will handle any elementary chapels and Brother Young typically covers the junior high and high school ones. Invitations will not be given every day, but some days the messages will naturally lead to an invitation and we will work towards allowing time to have one. We generally follow this kind of schedule:

Welcome by Pastor/Principal

Songs and Choruses (briefly)

Message

Invitation

Keeping announcements brief will be a great asset to the time needed for preaching. Although five minutes are not much at the beginning, it can be very detrimental at the end.

We are eager to see the Lord work in the lives of your students. Feel free to share specific requests so that we can be praying for the student body.

Getting the Most out of the Revival

1. Plan to be in every service. Change any schedules that conflict with the revival meeting. It will hurt the meeting if you invite unsaved folks who come the night you are not present.
2. Carefully plan for the week's meals. Preparing simple and quick meals will help you with the time involved in being faithful to the services. Consider purchasing and using paper plates, cups, and utensils.
3. Instruct children to finish their homework as soon as they get home from school. If the homework is finished before the services, they will enjoy the service more. It will also prevent you from having to hurry home and stay up later than necessary.
4. Commit to fasting from television! It will free up much time during the revival week and will allow your family to spend more time together following the services. It will even help you to get into bed earlier.
5. Commit to a daily time of family prayer. Read a few verses together or perhaps just take a few minutes to discuss the evening's revival sermon. Pray together for a few moments.
6. Work hard to have unsaved people present in each service. Remember that 3000 souls were saved at Pentecost because there were obviously at least 3000 souls present who needed to be saved. If we will work to have unsaved people present, God will undoubtedly save some! Let's pray that every unsaved person who attends will be saved. Sit with those you invite and help them with the hymnals and the Bibles. During the invitation time, consider inviting them to trust Christ. Be very sensitive to the prompting of the Holy Spirit!
7. Work hard to invite other believers to the services. Call those believers who are normally Sunday morning only attendees and encourage them to attend. Invite believers from other churches in town. Having guests each service will be an encouragement to everybody.
8. Take advantage of the nursery if you have small children. Babies will almost always distract in some way. They will enjoy the nursery and you will enjoy the service more since you will not have to constantly work at keeping them quiet and happy. Keeping the baby in the nursery will also help folks to devote their complete attention to the preaching of God's Word.
9. Be an avid participator! Sing with all your heart. Fellowship with one another. Give in the offerings. Respond to the invitations as God prompts you to do so.
10. Sit together as a family. Perhaps in one of the services you will need to kneel as a family and pray together. Allow God to work mightily in your entire family.
11. Pray much. Pray every day for revival among the saved; for conviction in the lives of those who are lost or backslidden; and for conversion in the heart of those who are unsaved. Pray that souls will be added to the church!

Summary of Our Most Asked Questions

1. To whom do we make the offering and expense checks?
Make each check payable to *David Young Evangelistic Association* and designate as *expenses* and *offering*.
2. How much should the expense check be?
Our normal expenses average \$450.00 per meeting.
3. How many meals will be needed during the week?
In most revivals, we eat with the Pastor and his family on Sunday, and prefer four meals delivered to the church (or trailers) Monday through Thursday. If one meal can be delivered around noon each of those four days we are able to eat our “big” meal earlier in the day. We often eat the leftovers for a light dinner and as a result are much better prepared for the services each evening. We are very flexible and will work hard to accommodate anything you feel you should do. We do request that the church use caution in our scheduling as we will have a full day of school most days of the week. It is imperative that we stay on schedule so we can continue to travel as a family and team.
4. What about the Friday meal?
It is our habit to take care of our own meals on that day.
5. What age group does the team normally wish to have for the *Children’s Revival Hour*?
We normally take 4 years old through 6th Grade, if the 4 year old can sit for the Bible story and the preaching. We request that the nursery handle those who are younger or who are not yet trained to sit quietly in the service.
6. What are the most important matters for us to consider as we prepare for the revival?
Prayer is essential. Working to get unbelievers to the services is essential as well. Special nights will help. Making soul winning a priority will too. Encourage, encourage, encourage the church family to get their family and friends to the revival campaign.
7. What if we do not have the proper RV electrical plugs?
First of all, the plugs are relatively easily installed by almost anyone who has some knowledge of electrical systems. We usually purchase the receptacles and wiring at places like Lowes or Home Depot. When it is necessary for us to do so, we can usually locate other means of providing electricity for the trailers.
